

Rack *and* Ride

Now you can ride the bus and ride your bike all in the same trip! CamTran buses are equipped with front-mounted bike racks to allow riders to combine biking and busing for your work, school, shopping or getting to your favorite area bike trail.

The entire urban bus fleet and one rural large (Johnstown-Ebensburg) bus are equipped with bike racks. The CamTran+ buses are not able to support the racks due to their small size. Bringing bike racks to CamTran enables us to become a more intermodal transit system.

It helps the environment too by giving this option to our customers and residents of Cambria County. It is very easy to use the bike racks.

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The following policies are in effect:

1. Usage of bike racks is free, one bike per person. Neither the bus nor other bikes make contact with your bike.
2. Bikes can be loaded during daylight hours.
3. Bike loading is on a first come, first served basis
4. No bikes are allowed inside the bus.
5. You are responsible for loading/unloading your bike in a timely manner. For safety reasons, bus operators cannot get off the bus to help you. (takes under 20 seconds to load/unload.)
6. Two-wheeled bikes are allowed on bike racks (wheels at least 41 cm (16 inches). Tricycles and motorized bikes are not permitted.
7. Children 12 years or under must be accompanied by an adult in order to use the bike racks. The adult must secure the bike on the rack.
8. Bikes must be loaded onto the rack from the curbside.
9. Bikes are not to be locked to the bike rack or bus.
10. The bike's front wheel may be locked to the bike frame before the bus arrives.
11. You cannot ride your bike within the downtown transit center.
12. Bike rack stations will be available at the transit center and at the Incline.
13. Use of bike racks will not be permitted when ice or snow are on the ground.
14. Bikes are mounted at your own risk. CamTran is not responsible for theft or damage while your bike is on the rack or if left at a bike rack station.

Loading your bike on the bike rack:

Please have your bike ready to load before the bus arrives by making sure it is free of all loose items. Wait for the bus on the sidewalk. When the bus arrives, inform the bus operator that you will be loading your bike. Load from the curbside only.



- 1 At the front of the bus, while holding your bike with one hand, grab, squeeze and pull the bike rack handle, then lower the rack out and away from the bus.



- 2 Lift your bike onto the rack, fitting the bike wheels into the slots closest to the bus. A label tells you where the front wheel goes.



- 3 Steady and secure your bike by lifting and setting the support arm over your bike's tire, not over the fender or frame.



- 4 You're done! You can now board the bus.

NOTE: It's your responsibility that your bike fits securely in the rack.

Unloading your bike from the bike rack:

Remember to put the bike rack in its upright and locked position if you are the last to use it.

- 1 Tell the driver you need to unload your bike when you approach your stop.

- 2 Raise the support arm off the tire. Move the support arm down, out of your way and lift your bike out of the rack.

- 3 If the rack is empty, and no one else is waiting to load a bike, fold up the rack until it locks in place.

- 4 Return to the curb with your bike, signal the driver that you are clear of the bus and wait for the bus to leave before entering traffic.
